

Chapel Hill, March 5.—(AP)—By winning the mile relay, last event of the third annual Southern Conference indoor track meet here tonight, the University of North Carolina retained its championship in a thrilling finish.

Captain Weil, anchor man for the Tar Heels, widened their lead in the final quarter to win the relay.

The Tar Heels rolled up 24 6-7 points, to 21 6-7 for Louisiana State, with whom they were tied for first when the last event began. L. S. U. won third place in the relay.

Georgia ran third with 19. Other scores were: Virginia 18 5-14; Duke 15; Tulane 10; V. P. I. 8 5-14; Mississippi 5; N. C. State 3; Georgia Tech 2; Washington and Lee 1 5-7; Kentucky 1; South Carolina 6-7.

Carolina Frosh Also Win

North Carolina's freshmen also made it two championships in a row, with 17 1-2 points. Other freshman scores were: Richmond, 15; William and Mary 8 1-2; Virginia 6; Duke 5; N. C. State 3.
