

Chapel Hill, March 9.—(AP)—The University of North Carolina won the Southern Conference track and field championships here tonight for the second straight year.

Duke's Blue Devils ranked second.

The Tar Heels scored a total of 44 1-2 points. Other team scores in the conference division: Duke 27, Maryland 24, Virginia 17, Washington and Lee 10; Virginia Poly 6 1-2; Virginia Military 1.

Ten new records, six of them in the conference division, were marked up in the 26-event program.
