

Williamson Breaks Record In Half-Mile Run; Wins Mile Also

Towns, World Record Holder in
High Hurdles, Shatters Non-
Conference Record

RELAY RECORD BROKEN

Amassing a total of 21½ points in the afternoon events, the Duke Blue Devils continued their blazing pace to win the crown in the seventh annual Southern Conference indoor track classic, last night in the Tin Can.

Harry Williamson of Carolina, running his last meet for the White and Blue, set a new indoor track record for the 880-yard run and took first place in the mile, missing his old record by 2 2-10 seconds.

Before the furious onslaught of the four divisions, eight records fell and one was tied. The conference division broke records in the one-mile relay, 880-yard run, 440-yard run. The non-conference division set new records in the one-mile relay, 70-yard high hurdles, 880-yd. run and tied the record in the 60-yd. dash. The freshman division broke records, in the one-mile relay and 60-yd. dash.

Williamson Wins

The conference 880 proved the closest and most interesting race of the evening. Harry Williamson of North Carolina trailed Headley of Maryland for almost the entire route.

On the last lap Williamson set out after Headley, and about 10 yards from the finish overtook him to set a new record. His old record of 2:09.9 was also broken by Headley and St. John, as he registered the time of 1:57.4.

Towns Breaks Record

Rivaling the 880 in interest was the spectacular performance of Forrest Towns of Georgia, in the non-conference 70-yd. high hurdles. Towns was clocked 8.6 three times during the course of the meet, twice in the trials and once in the finals. This new time replaces the old record of 9.1 established by Norton of Catholic University in 1934.

The Duke Blue Devils, new conference champs, had things pretty much their own way in the afternoon events. Hanes took first honors with a leap of 22 ft. 1½ inches and his teammates Pickard, Myers and Sizemore took second, third and fourth places to give the Devils

only a few feet remaining he opened up with a burst of speed which carried him across the line a winner. Frey and Peaslee of Maryland finished second and third respectively.

Bob Packard, of Georgia, set a new record for the freshman 60-yd. dash when he was clocked in 6.4. The old record was held by Evans of Davidson and was 6.5.
