

Duke Trackmen Dethrone Tarheels' Indoor Team

Blue Devils Clinch Victory by Coming Second in Mile Relay, Final Event of Southern Conference Meet.

Chapel Hill, N. C., Feb. 26.—(AP)—Duke university dethroned the University of North Carolina tonight as Southern conference indoor track champion and won the ninth annual games by taking second in the mile relay, final event of the meet.

The lead had switched back and forth between the Blue Devils and Tarheels during the final events and when Carolina failed to place in the relay, Duke won by a score of 40 to 38. Carolina entered the event leading, 38 to 37.

Hubert Reavis and Bill Morse scored 25 of Dukes' points in a beautiful exhibition of individual ability. Reavis took three first places for 15 points and individual honors. In addition he was anchor man on the relay team which placed behind Maryland's record setting quartet.

Bill Morse shared honors for Duke by taking the mile and two mile runs for 10 points and individual runner-up honors.

The University of North Carolina led the meet through eight of the 12 conference events, Duke pulling a tie at 27-all when Morse sprinted the last 200 yards of the mile to take the event in 10 minutes 25.8 seconds.

Reavis put Duke ahead by taking the 70-yard low hurdles in 7.9 seconds and the crowd went wild as Jimmie Davis, North Carolina soph, set a new record in the 880 at 1 minute 57.3 seconds, one-tenth faster than Harry Williamson's time in 1936 to put North Carolina ahead, 38 to 37. The relay then told the story.

Three new relay records were set. Maryland's conference mile team, Miller, Theis, Kehoe and Cronin, marked up a time of 3 minutes 29.7 seconds. In the non-conference Georgetown's Bogan, Warden, Motzenbecker and Reeves, set a new time of 3 minutes 26.5 seconds. In the freshman relay Georgetown's team of Burke, Newumeyer, Bertucci and Alnyck did the distance in 3 minutes 33 seconds.

The other divisional championships went to Virginia in the nonconference, Georgetown in the freshman and Maury high of Norfolk, Va., in the scholastic. Defending champions were Virginia, North Carolina and Newport News high, Newport News, Va., and Goldsboro high.
