

Virginia won the freshman division. The scores were: Virginia 23, North Carolina 14 2-5, VPI 6, Duke 5 2-5, William & Mary 5 1-5, N. C. State 1.

The Tar Heels' score was 55 1-3. Maryland was second with 29 and Duke third with 23 2-3. Other conference scores were Washington and Lee 16, Richmond 4, South Carolina 3, and William and Mary 1.

Navy won the non-conference division title and Washington-Lee High of Arlington, Va., the scholastic honors. Virginia triumphed in the freshman division with 23, and North Carolina was second with 14 2-5, VPI next with 6, Duke 5 2-5, William and Mary 5 1-5 and NC State 1.

Non-conference scores were: Navy 35 3-4, Virginia 20 3-4, Newberry 8 1-2, Georgia 5, Georgia Tech 3, and Westchester State Teachers College 3.
