Duke held a lead from the first of the 12 conference division events up to the start of the mile reley. The score then was: Duke 38 1-6, North Carolina 35 1-3.

Carolina's mile relaymen, fighting to give the University its eighth indoor title in the 12 years of the games, put on the pressure. The result of that decisive mile relay was not in doubt, so far as Duke was concerned, after the first lap. Mike Wise, of Carolina, kept his team close in the running, so that Billy Grove could go into the lead and first leg for the Blue Devils, and was far behind the field when the baton was passed. He apparently ran himself out too quickly, or became sick, as he staggered off the banked track once during his leg. The final conference division cores were: North Carolina 40 1-3, Duke 8s 1-6, Maryland 16, William Caroling of the Carolina decision of the configuration of of the 12 conference division events Three records were set and one was equalled.

A crowd of more than 2,500 watched the track circus run in its four divisions: Conference, varsity non-conference, freshman and schools was accorded as non-conference. lastic. Navy repeated as non-con-ference champ, North Carolina won the frosh division and Thomas Jef-ferson high of Richmond the scholastic.

After Duke got away to a headstart, North Carolina first closed
the gap appreciably by a sweep of
10 points in the 70-yard high
hurdles. That was the fifth event.
Duke led 22 1-6 to 7 1-3 before that.
Then it was close the rest of the
way, with Carolina trailing until

(Pinky) Hargrave of Trumas Jefferson high, Richmond, Vo. secame the fifth man to step the scholastic division 60-yard dash in the record time of 6.5 seconds. That pace was first set by Stevens of Boys high, Atlanta, Ga, in 1934 and was equalled by Pair of Tech high, Atlanta, in 1937 and then in 1939 and 1940 by Logg of Wash-ington and Lee high, Arlington, Va.
