

FRESHMAN AGE SENSATIONAL IN MEET

Contributes 25 Points to Carolina's Southern Track Carnival Triumph.

CHAPEL HILL, Feb. 28 —(AP)—

Freshman sensational Bill Albans staged an unprecedented sweep of five events, two in record time, to lead the University of North Carolina to victory tonight in the Southern Conference indoor games.

The 21-year-old Cranford, N. J. star turned in the greatest one-man show in the history of the event in this order:

1—Won the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet, 1 7/8 inches.

2—Won the high jump with a record 6 foot 4 1/2 inch leap. The old mark was 6-3.

3—Won the 60-yard dash in 65.5.

4—Won the 75-yard high hurdles in 68.6.

5—Won the 75-yard low hurdles in 67.8. The old mark was 67.8.

In winning the event for the 10th time in its 14-year history, Bob Fetter's North Carolina team rolled up 52 points, 25 of them by Albans.

Favored Maryland placed second with 33. Other point makers in the 13-team conference bracket:

Duke 25; VPI 9; South Carolina 4; N. C. State and VMI 3; Wake Forest 2; Davidson 1.

In the non-conference field of 11 schools Georgia Tech took top honors with 36 points to runner-up Tennessee's 20. Other points:

Virginia 14; Florida 10; Georgia 8; LSU 5; Roanoke 2.

The freshman group was led by Maryland with 15 1/2 points. Other points in the 19-school competition:

Duke and VPI 8; N. C. State 6; South Carolina and Georgetown 5; Washington and Lee 4 1/2 and Davidson 1.

The scholastic field drew 17 schools with George Washington of Alexandria, Va. retaining its title with 14 points. The other scores:

Washington and Lee High, Arlington, Va., 11; Newport News, Va. High 10; Weatherly Forest 8; Thomas Jefferson 4; Disher, Columbia, S. C., 3; University High, Columbia; High Point High and Georgia Military 2; and Marietta, Ga. 1.

The meet produced five other records in addition to the pair set by Albans.

Maryland's mark also took set a new conference mark of 328.5 for the mile. Paul Dohy, George McGowan, Mario Salvatorelli and Ed Matthews united their talents to crack the old record 328.5.

Two non-conference marks were set up. Florida's Sam Commodore high-jumped 6 feet 1 1/4 inches as against the old mark of 5-10 1/4. Tennessee's Martin Kirk reached the pole vault standard with a 12 foot, 4 1/4 inch vault. The former was 12-2.
