

Tar Heels Win Track Meet; Albans Takes Three Titles

Carolina Dominates Indoor Games to Win 6th Indoor Track Title

Chapel Hill, Feb. 25.—(AP)—The magic feet of hurdler-jumper Bill Albans set a bristling pace tonight as North Carolina won the Southern Conference indoor track title for the sixth straight time.

Albans, a five-event winner last year, swept three today and added a tie for second to account for 17½ of the Tar Heels' 60 points. Runner-up Maryland scored 38½ points.

Albans, who last fall suffered a neck injury while playing freshman football and for a time seemed to be through with athletics, received most of his competition from his own teammates.

Jack Moody dethroned him as high jump champion in a lengthy afternoon duel and another Tar Heel, Bob Morrow, gave Albans all he could handle in both hurdle events, pressing him to the final few yards.

In the broad jump, which Albans won with a 22-foot eight and one-half inch leap, Moody was No. 2.

Shot Put Record.

The lone conference division record went to Jack Unterkofler, 210-pound sophomore from Maryland. He beat Defending Champion, Jim O'Leary of Duke with a 49 foot seven and three-fourth inch toss and eclipsed by more than two feet the old mark set by Duke's Steve Lach.

Navy won the non-conference competition with 27 points, North Carolina took the freshman laurels with 10 5-6 and Washington-Lee High of Arlington, Va., led the scholastic group with 14.

Jones Sets Mark.

In addition to Unterkofler's shot put record, two other new marks were set. Freshman Bob Jones of N. C. State set a three-quarter mile record of 3:09.7. Tennessee's Tom Scott retained his non-conference mile crown in record 4:23 fashion.

A major surprise saw Duke's 440-yard winner of a year ago, John Grisso, fail to qualify for the finals, won by Wilber Harrison of VMI.

Champions to retain titles included Maryland's Bob Palmer in the mile and Jim Unbarger in the 880 and North Carolina two-miler Sam Magill.

Navy's Jim Oberhaltzer turned in one of the meet's most brilliant performances. In his afternoon 880 heat he fell rounding the first turn, but came back after spotting precious yards to the field to place second and qualify for the finals which he won handily.

North Carolina's team title was its 11th in 15 years and the 60 points one of the highest winning totals.
