

# Tar Heels Sweep Indoor Games Title

## Carolina Uses Team Strength To Win; Maryland Terps Finish In Third

CHAPEL HILL, Feb. 24.—(AP)—North Carolina's host Tar Heels tonight won their seventh straight Southern Conference indoor track title and their 12th in the 16 years the event has been held. Coach Bob Fetzer's Tar Heels piled up 54 points to 39 for runnerup Duke and 26 for third place Maryland.

North Carolina made good use of its over-all team strength to pile up needed points in its march to the title. The winners took four of the 12 first places outright and tied for a fifth. Duke and Maryland each won three, with North Carolina State the only team to break into the domination of the big three, with a two-mile victory by bespectacled Clyde Garrison, conference cross country champion.

North Carolina piled up six seconds and five thirds, while Duke could manage only four seconds and three thirds and Maryland's best was one second and a tie for third in the scramble for extra points.

Not a single conference record was broken or even equalled. The statistical show was stolen by the non-conference division where two marks were shattered, by Navy and Florida performers.

Bob Cameron, Navy's little shot put ace, paced the Middies to their team championship with a toss of 49 feet 9 1/4 inches and Jay Hall, a rugged blond Sophomore from Florida, set a new high jump standard of six feet, six and one-quarter inches.

Each not only broke a non-conference record, but also excelled the recognized mark in the Southern Conference division.

Georgia Tech's James Shiver, who took both hurdles, was the only double winner in any of the 23 events spread over four classes. The point standing:
