

Terps Shade Duke Devils; Carolina 3rd

CHAPEL HILL, March 1 (AP) — Maryland won its first Southern Conference indoor track championship tonight, outpointing Duke in a closely contested meet, 37 1-4 to 31 3-4. North Carolina, winner for the previous seven years, finished third with 19 3-4 points.

In adding the indoor honors to the outdoor crown it won last spring, Maryland grabbed four firsts and tied for another. After the final tally was in, the jubilant Terps hauled Coach Jim Keboe up on their shoulders and carried him around the Wollen Gymnasium track.

Duke ran off with three firsts and tied for a fourth.

Alabama won the non-conference division honors with 36 points to runnerup Georgia Tech's 16 1-2. The freshman laurels went to North Carolina with 21 points to 13 for runnerup Virginia. Craddock, Va., High, paced the scholastic group with 10 points to nine for Virginia's Woodberry Forest School.
