## Virginia Tech Runs Second In Southern Conference Meet

LEXINGTON, Feb. 19 (AP)—VMI's Keydets copped eight of the 12 events on the program here tonight to win the annual Southern Conference indoor track and field meet with a total of 56 19/20 points—more than double the score of their nearest rival.

Simultaneously, Roanoke's Maroons ran away with the Mason-Discon Conference meet as expected, piling up 53 1/6 points in competition that produced 10 new records.

Lynchburg College was Roanoke's closest challenger, but the Hornets didn't even come close. Lynchburg's final total was 24 5/6. Strung out behind the two leaders were Catholic University, 17; Bridgewater, 15; Randolph-Macon, 9½; Hamp-den-Sydney, 8, and Towson Teachers, 41/2. VMI, completely dominating the Southern Conference field, had three double winners in Dale Vaughn, who took the broad jump and the high jump; Carter Valentine, a victor in both the high and low hurdles, and Ben Angle, who captured the 440 and 880-yard runs. Angle also anchored the winning Keydet mile team.

Davidson's Pete Ashcraft also notched two firsts, taking both the mile and two-mile runs.

ANGLE'S RUNNING in the mile relay was among the outstanding performances of the Southern Conference show. The star VMI distance man took the baton on the anchor leg with a 15-yard deficit and made it up in a hurry, finishing 15 yards in front at the wire.

All but two events on the 12event Mason-Dixon Conference program produced new records. This was only the third time the meet had been held.
