With seven of the 16 events left, the Indians had 60 points to 27 for Furman and 26 for East Carolina, which began to fade after upstagging the Indians by setting records in two of the three afternoon events:

Walter Davenport of East Carolina started the recordbreaking with a leap of 23 feet, 51/2 inches in the long jump that added slightly more than an inch to the mark set three years ago by VMI's John Decher. VMI's
