# Indians Sweep Title

LEXINGTON, Va. (AP) — William and Mary's Indians won three of the last four events, sweeping all five places in the two-mile, and captured their eighth straight Southern Conference indoor track and field championship Saturday night.

The Indians, trailing by three points with four events left, also took three places in the 1,000-yard run and three more in the 880 to finish with 103 points to 70 for East Carolina's Pirates.

Tim Cook sent the Indians into the lead by successfully defending his title in the two-mile with an 8:54.2 performance that took more than 17 seconds off the previous mark. His four teammates behind him all bettered the previous record.

Then Reggie Clark of the Indians set the sixth meet record of the night with a 2:12.5 clocking in the 1,000, in which he defeated teammate Al Sharrett, the defending champion and record-holder. Lewis McGehee wrapped it up by winning the 880 for the Indians.

Four records had been broken earlier and another automatic mark set with a number of defending champions being defeated.

Double winners were Walter Davenport of East Carolina in the long and triple jumps and Bill Dimitrouleas of Furman in the shot put and 35-pound

weight throw. Davenport was a repeat winner in the triple jump, Dimitrouleas in the shot put.

Dimitrouleas set a record of 51 feet, 10¼ inches in the weight throw, breaking the previous mark by more than ½ feet. Davenport went 49-11 in the triple jump, adding a foot to the previous mark.

Also getting into the record book were Fred Toepke of William and Mary, who cleared 6 feet, 8 inches in the high jump with last year's winner, Roy Quick of East Carolina, finishing third, and Jerome Napier, who was clocked in 49.9 seconds in the 440-yard dash.

Napier earlier had been dethroned in the 60-yard dash by Maurice Huntley of East Carolina. Teammate Norman Williams had lost his long jump title to Davenport.

Walter Cooke of William and Mary, last year's winner in the 440, stepped up the 600 to give the Indians a victory, and Mac Collins of William and Mary dethroned teammate Ron Martin in the mile as the Indians got a one-two finish in that event.
