

Antelope Valley JC Captures League Track Championship

Antelope Valley Junior College captured the 11th annual South Central Junior College Conference track and field title at La Playa Stadium yesterday, defeating defending champion Santa Barbara Junior College by a tight 2 $\frac{1}{3}$ points.

The outcome was in doubt until the broad jump, final event of the day, was completed and totals were announced. Antelope Valley picked up two places in the event and Santa Barbara one, and that was the margin of victory.

Three new conference records were established in the meet, with new marks being registered in the shot put, high jump and broad jump. Additionally, two Santa Barbara Junior College school marks were established in the mile run and the shot put.

George Chappell of Santa Barbara set a new shot mark with a toss of 48 ft. 1 in. The heave broke the old conference record of 45 ft. 7 in. set last year by Fitzgerald of Santa Barbara.

NEW JUMP MARK

Bobby Carter of Palo Verde with a high jump of 6 ft. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., broke the old record of 6 ft. 2 in. set in 1956 and held jointly by

Booth of Palo Verde and Hooker and Finch of Citrus.

Jim Scott of Antelope Valley turned in a broad jump of 21 ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., to break the old mark of 21 ft. 9 in., set by Mack of Palo Verde in 1953.

Ray Baldwin's time of 4:42.4 in winning the mile set a new Santa Barbara Junior College record, as did Chappell's shot toss.

In final standings, Antelope Valley won the meet with 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ points; Santa Barbara placed second with 67; Oceanside was third at 42 $\frac{1}{2}$; Palo Verde was fourth with 20 points, and Palomar was fifth with 6.

Santa Barbara took six first places in the meet, with Antelope Valley coming home with five wins. The final outcome was figured in the second through fifth place finishes, where Antelope Valley took the majority.

RELAP VICTORY

Highlight of the day was the mile relay, won by Santa Barbara in a battle with Antelope Valley. The Vaquero team of Ray Baldwin, Julius Varnado, Ken Gilbert and Art Ortega won each lap of the race, with Ortega whipping Jim Scott of Antelope Valley by a scant two feet in the final dash to the tape.

Individual winner in the meet was Ray Baldwin of Santa Barbara with a first in the mile and 880 and a leg in the winning mile relay. Scott of Antelope Valley won two events, the 440 and broad jump, and Chappell of Santa Barbara also won a pair, the shot and discus.

Medals were awarded to all participants for the first five

places in each event and the conference trophy was taken home by Antelope Valley.
