

Antelope Valley Retains Track Title, 4 Marks Set

Four new records, which will stand forever, were set yesterday in the 18th annual—and final—South Central Conference track meet at La Playa Stadium.

The records will go into the books as the last, because the league is being disbanded, with all member junior colleges moving into other conferences at the start of the school year next September.

NEW RECORDS

Standards were set in the 440 relay, the 120-yard high hurdles, the 330-yard intermediate hurdles and the javelin.

In addition, Santa Barbara City College records were set in the 440 relay, the 330 intermediate hurdles and the javelin.

The Vaqueros placed second in the meet, as Antelope

Valley successfully defended its title, with Oceanside-Carlsbad placing third and Imperial Valley trailing.

The Vaquero 440 relay team of Jim Esterle, Terry Dahl, Larry Melquiond and Nippy Banks knocked one full second off the old mark, turning in a flat 44 seconds. Antelope Val-

ley had set the record of 45 seconds last year. The effort is also a new SBCC mark.

Don Bush of Antelope Valley set a new record of 15.1 in the 120 high, breaking the old mark of 15.5 held by four others.

Esterle of Santa Barbara won the 330 intermediate in 40.4, breaking the old mark of 42 flat, and it is also a new school record.

Bob Selby of Oceanside-Carlsbad set a conference mark of 204 ft. 1½ in. in the javelin, bettering the old mark of 176 ft. 1 in. Dahl of SBCC placed second with a toss of 192½, a new school record.

TRIPLE WINNERS

Harry Armstrong of Imperial Valley was a triple winner, taking the triple jump, long jump and 220-yard dash.

Gene Vernon of Santa Barbara was a double winner, with a first in the 440 dash and the anchor leg on the mile relay. Esterle had a triple with a 440-relay leg, the mile relay, and the 330 intermediates. Melquiond also was a double winner for Santa Barbara with a first in the discus and a leg in the 440 relay, and Dahl and Banks were double winners on the 440 and mile relay teams.
