

New Shot-Put And High Jump Marks Set at Carnival

World's 100-Yard Record Tied; Hodges Wins Javelin Throw

Midwestern track and field stars walked off with nearly all the honors in the annual Texas relays here Friday, but they were unable to take back many records.

A strong, cold north wind cut down the time in all the relay races. It helped Peyton Glass of Oklahoma A. and M. twice tie the recognized world's record of 9 5-16 seconds in the 100-yard dash.

The two relay record-breakers were Hugh Rhea of Nebraska in the shot and John Russell, high jumper, and the only entrant of Bradley Polytechnic institute of Peoria, Ill. Rhea, a football and track star for the Corn Huskers, heaved the shot 51 feet, 2 1-8 inches. The old record was 48 feet, 7 1-4 inches, set last year by Big Jim Bausch of Kansas. Russell cleared six feet, 4 5-8 inches in the high jump. The old record was six feet, 4 1-2 inches, made by Tom Poor of Kansas in 1925.

Not only did Glass twice turn the century in 9.5, but he also gave the Oklahoma Aggies a victory in the half mile relay through his great work on the last 220-yard stretch. The muscular 19-year-old sophomore thereby topped off a great day.

Medley Thrilling

Perhaps the most thrilling relay race was the medley, which was won by Marquette, the favorite, but only by a step. Glenn Dawson, Oklahoma's great miler, and J. Walter, Marquette's anchor man, were almost abreast as they sprinted the last 220 yards. F. Walter had given the other Walter a slight lead, which he lost, but then barely regained in that last brilliant sprint.

Kansas, Iowa State, Northwestern and the Pittsburg, Kan., Teachers divided the top positions in the other relay races. Kansas was first as expected in the 440-yard relay and the same was true of Bob Simpson's Iowa State quartet in the four-mile relay. Northwestern finished first in the mile relay in a close battle with Rice, and the Pittsburg Teachers copped the two-mile relay.

Glass barely beat John Hass of Minnesota in the 10-yard dash, and Hass' teammate, Charles Scheffley, defeated Hager of Iowa State in the 120-yard high hurdles.

Longhorn Wins

Alvin Jenkins of the Oklahoma Aggies finished an easy first in the 2000-meter run. His time was nine minutes, 7.2 seconds. Mell of Oklahoma lacked only 2 7-8 inches of breaking the relay record in the broad jump. The Sooner star leaped 24 feet, 4 inches.

Southwestern conference athletes placed first in two of the field events. Howard Sprague of Southern Methodist university hurled the discus 133 feet, 10 inches, and Hodges of Texas hurled the javelin 181 feet, 9 1-4 inches.

About the only upset of the day was the defeat of Tom Warne, Northwestern star, in the pole vault. Warne holds the relay record of 12 feet 8 1-2 inches. Friday Lanerud of Drake had to vault only 12 feet to beat him.

The crowd Friday was disappointingly small. Nearly all of them wore topcoats. The athletes planned to go from here to Houston, where they will participate in the Rice Relays Saturday.

San Angelo's crack relay artists, Cobb, Simpson, Delker and Brother, won both the mile and medley relay races. Wicker of Woodrow Wilson of Dallas tied the high school record of 16 seconds flat in winning the 100-yard dash.

Abilene Christian college, the Emporia, Kan., Teachers and Daniel Baker divided first place honors in the three college class relays.

Hardman of Weatherford Junior college stepped the high hurdles in 15.4 seconds.
