Brigham Young University's great trio of high jumpers leaped their way into prominence Saturday night when they all placed and brought the Cougars from a 10-point deficit to the title in the first WAC indoor track and field meet at the Salt Palace.

Ken Lundmark, Chris Celson and Dan Menderhall captured the Cougar points to give the Cats the crown.

The Cougars scored 18 points in the high jump and ended up with 136 points to 128 for Texas-El Paso which didn't score in the high jump.

New Mexico was third with 101 points, Arizona State was fourth with 56 followed by Arizona with 25, Utah with 22, Colorado State with 14 and Wyoming with 13.

Snared Lead

The Texas-El Paso team had forged into the lead by virtue of a big splurge of points in the shot put, but BYU more than matched that with the points in the high jump.

Meanwhile, Altti Alarotu of BYU had won the pole vault and a virtually unknown teammate, Mario Ray, had taken third place in a bit of a surprise.

The final running event of the day, the mile relay, found New Mexico winning, but BYU edged out UTEP for second and that assured the victory as the high jumpers continued.

Cat Winners

Winners for BYU aside from the pole vault were rather scarce Saturday, but Paul Hackett won the 600-yard run in the fine time of 1:10.2.

And Stan Bergeson of BYU won the 1,000-yard run to pick up a gold medal along with his twin brother, Steve, Steve won the 880 Friday.

Hold Breath

BYU athletes and fans held their breath for moments Saturday as their great quarter-miler and intermediate hurdler, Ralph Mann, stepped on the edge of the track after a lap in the relay and fell to the boards in great pain. However, it turned out to be a severe sprain instead of a break as first feared.

Mann wasn't able to run in the mile relay and his presence might have meant a victory there.
