Tartars Break Four Records, Capture Title

Compton College track and field specialists smashed four meet records and the title aspirations of L.A. City College in successfully defending its Western State Conference cinder crown before 1500 frigid fans last night in the Coliseum.

Coach Herschel Smith's Tartars amassed 127½ points to retain their title, a comfortable margin over the 109 1-8 points piled up by the second-place Cubs. Glendale was a surprisingly strong third with 102 points.

Walters Sparkles

Tartar Jerome Walters scratched out of the mile and 440 to assault the 880 record and he responded with a sparkling 1m. 54.7s. effort. The old mark was 1m. 58.2s.

Other Compton records were set by Herman Wyatt in the high jump at 6ft. 4in.; Gerald Perry in the shot at 48ft. 4in. and George Brown in the broad jump at 23ft. 1½in.

A fifth record went by the boards when both Al Sandusky of Glendale and Dick Shivers of Muir wiggled over the pole vault bar at 13ft. 2¾in.

Exciting Relay

Most exciting event of the evening was the mile relay in which Walters piled up a 10-yard Compton lead on the third lap and Andy Williamson held the advantage on the anchor lap over L.A.'s Ed Washington. On the second lap Cub Jim Bell lost a shoe half way home and still managed to make up nearly 15 yards on Tartar Bob Dolan. The time was a disappointing 3m. 22.9s.
