LACC Cinder Team Takes WSC Crown

Los Angeles City College's heavily favored cinder squad won the All-Western State Conference track title last night under the arcs at Compton, but it had to go the limit to do it.

The Cubs collected a high total of 137½ points. Right behind with 122½ points came Glendale CC, which had led for two-thirds of the meet. Compton, with 78, was third. Muir, (46½), Pasadena (40) and Ventura (8) trailed in that order.

Broad Jump Mark

Broad Jumper Bob Holland, elongated Cub springboard, was the lone record breaker of the meet. He took a leap of 23ft. 3¼in. to eclipse the old record of 23ft. 1¼in., set by Compton's George Brown in 1950. Wilbur Williams, ace half-miler on Coach Wendell Smith's Cub team, won by the slim margin of a half foot over Glendale's D. Vogel in the excellent time of 1:58.7, fastest 880 of the Western State Conference season.

You could have thrown a blanket around the one-two-three finishers in the quarter-mile dash. Winning at the wire was Albert Moore of LACC, who hit the tape just ahead of Teammate Howard Smith and Compton's James Burks. Moore stopped the clock at 50.6.

Button Victor

Bob Button, Coach Walt Smith's mile specialist at Glendale, won the four-lapper in the good time of 4:29.6. Jackrabbit Joe Tyler won the two-mile as expected, the LACC ace stepping off the distance in 9:56.

Only double winner was Joe Graffo, Compton's speed-ball, who collected the blue ribbon in both the 100 and 200. Respective times were 10 flat and 22.2.
