# CUBS TAKE TITLE IN ALL-LOOP MEET

As expected, Los Angeles City College's favored Cubs romped to another team championship in yesterday's wind-buffed All-Western State Conference track finals at Glendale CC.

Coach Wendell Smith's spikers corraled a winning total of 136 24/35 points to easily beat out second-place Compton, which netted 109. Glendale, Muir, Pasadena and Ventura trailed in that order.

## Tricky Wind

A tricky wind, that would hammer away from one direction and then completely reversed its course and come gusting in from the opposite side, had the boys running slow motion at times and some lustreless clockings resulted.

Glendale's 9.9 runner, Dave Reardon, won the 100 in a slow 10.5 against the wind. The meet's only double victor, Reardon, also captured the 220 in a 21.9 time.

Compton's Charlie Strong won the mile as expected but

was upset in the two-mile. After taking the four-lapper in a disappointing 4:30.9. Strong ran second to Glendale's Jim Corcoran in the eight-lapper. Corcoran was 15 yards ahead at the tape in 10:00.1.

## Trott Taken

Glendale's Bob Trott, boaster of a 1:58.8 880 time, was only able to take third in his specialty as his teammate, Bob Corsello, triumphed in 2:00.6.

Pasadena's Larry Ross pushed the shot 49ft. 1/2 in. Glendale's Mel Hill and Pasadena's Ernie Warren both vaulted over 13ft., LACC's James Barrow skilled the lows in 24.4, and Compton's mile relay foursome, nipping LACC by a yard in speedy 3:24.9 time.
