# TARTAR TRACKMEN WIN JAYSEE MEET

A crosswind, wicked at times, buffeted Los Angeles CC's Snyder Field yesterday afternoon but it evidently wasn't devilish enough to prevent a collection of exceptional performances that accentuated the 7th staging of the All-Western State Conference track and field championships.

Compton won as expected with the second highest point total in the history of the affair. Coach Herschel Smith's Tartars amassed 146 points with LACC their closest rival at 127. Glendale (77), Pasadena (55), Muir (23) and Ventura (6) followed.

## Long Leap Mark

Only one meet record was erased and that by Art Scott of LACC in the broad jump. Scott sailed 23ft. 10½in. to rub out the 23ft. 6¾in. mark set by teammate Ed Cazenave, who established his standard last Tuesday in the trials. Compton's Fred Miller offered a 23ft. 6¾in. spring for third.

Bob Corsello, Glendale's diminutive stepper, finished with plenty of power for an outstanding 1:56.3 half-mile triumph, second best by a Southland JC this season. Muir's Marshall Clark (1:57 flat) and Glendale's Carl Jaffe (1:58.2) ran second and third.

## Swift Sprints

LACC's fancy-stepping George Hutcherson won both the 100 and the 220, turning the century in 9.9 and really humming around the curve in a lickety-split 21.6 furlong.

Lionel Daniel, who personally contributed 24½ points to the Compton cause, zoomed to victories in both hurdle events.

Despite losing some ground when he knocked over the final barrier, Daniel still managed a 14.8 time in the 120 highs. And around the curve on the 220 lows he registered a zippy 24.5.

Compton, shaving the LACC quartet by a foot and a half in a thriller, won the mile relay in 3:20.7 time.

## Fast Laps

A 48.2 leg by Tartar Fred Schermerhorn and a 48.5 carry by Hutcherson of the Cubs highlighted the race. Art Outerbridge, Compton's star quarter-miler, who contributed a poor 52.9 leg, competed despite a slight touch of the flu.

All-conference finals in the three other Southland JC leagues are programmed today and tonight. This afternoon the Eastern Conference convenes at 1:30 in Riverside and the South Centrals the same time at Citrus JC. The Metropolitan loop meets under the Santa Monica CC arcs at 7:30 p.m.
