

Raiders' distance specialist Ramon Perez won both the 1,500- and 5,000-meter races in leading the Moorpark College men's team to a fourth-place finish in the Western State Conference track and field championships Saturday night at Bakersfield College.

Perez, named the male athlete of the meet, won the 1,500 in 3:59.31 and the 5,000 in 15:16.46 to become the only double winner among the Raiders' men and women in the meet.

The Lady Raiders, meanwhile, rode a pair of second-place finishes by Carol Myszkowski in the long jump and triple jump and a first and a third by Colleen Gavin in the 400 and 200 to a second-place standing in the women's competition.

In the men's competition, Bakersfield finished first with 167 points followed by Ventura, 134; Glendale, 115; Moorpark, 114; Santa Monica, 94; Cuesta, 63; LA Valley, 44; Santa Barbara, 36; Canyons, 10; West LA, 3; and Oxnard, 0.

In the women's events, it was Bakersfield, 173; Moorpark, 97; Glendale, 88½; Santa Barbara, 79; Ventura, 65; Santa Monica, 64.5; Cuesta, 53; LA Valley, 21; Oxnard,

14; West LA, 4; Canyons, 0.

In all, Perez, Myszkowski and Gavin topped a list of 17 Moorpark athletes and four relay teams that qualified for the Southern California prelims at Cerritos College on Saturday. The top five finishers in each men's event in the WSC meet and the top six finishers in each women's event qualified for the upcoming prelims.

In the men's events, Travis Cooksey won the 800 in 1:54.67; Matt Thompson was second in the 3,000 Steeplechase (9:47.46); and Chris Anderson was third in the triple jump at 44-10.

Matt Guetschoff was fourth in the 800 (1:56.44), while fifth-place finishes were rung up by Gil Carrillo in the long jump (22-5); Brent Shannon in the hammer (88-4); Mike Carmichael in the 110 hurdles (15.77) and Gary Aanerud in the 800 (1:57.95).

The men's 4 x 100 quartet of Gordon Prescod, Paul Lefton, Danny Cross and Carillo was fifth in 42.50; the 4 x 400 unit of Scott Roberts, Cooksey, Guetschoff and Cross was fifth in 3.20.5.

Among the women, Gavin won the

400 in 57.0, and was third in the 200 at 26.47. Myszkowski was second in both the long jump (17-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ) and the triple jump (35-9).

Remara Jones placed in two events by finishing fourth in the 400 hurdles (1:11.81) and the 100 hurdles (17.36). Leticia Melgoza placed sixth in the 5,000 (19:35.4) and the 3,000 (11:05.43).

Elsewhere, Lisa Noller was third in the 800 (2:24.5); Laurie Braaten was fifth in the triple jump (33-8 $\frac{1}{4}$ ); Anna Howald was sixth in the 1,500 (5:01.5) and Vicky Wagenbach was fifth in the 400 hurdles (1:13.14)

In the relays, the Raiders' 4 x 400 quartet of Howald, Noller, Wagenbach and Gavin was first in 4:05.28; the women's 4 x 100 unit of Mary Bitner, Noller, Wagenbach and Gavin was fourth in 50.0. The time was a school record.
