

TALLEY WINS CENTURY DASH AT FRESNO RELAYS

FRESNO, May 15. — Adrian Talley, fleet University of Southern California sprinter, opened Troy's bid for honors in the eleventh annual West Coast Relays before 10,000 fans here tonight when he won the 100-yard dash with a furious burst of speed at the finish.

Talley had to put on everything he had to catch Mushy Pollock, Bear star, who, as usual, got away to a fast start. But once Talley caught Pollock at the 80-yard mark it was all over, the Trojan winning by a good yard. The time was 9.7s.

ROBINSON VICTOR

Mack Robinson, Negro star from Pasadena Junior College, captured the 100-yard dash for Jaysee athletes, running the distance in 9.7s. to triumph by a yard over Jeffrey of Riverside.

Sam Francis, Nebraska's All-America football player and one of the few southpaw shot-putters in captivity, had little trouble winning his specialty. His mark of 52ft. 10in. was one of the best ever made here.

Bill Reitz, U.C.L.A. javelin ace, gave Bruin rooters something to shout about when he fired the spear 216ft. to snatch the lead away from Alton Terry of Har-

din Simmons University, national intercollegiate record holder, in the first round of competition.

COLE GALLOPS

With the versatile Cecil Cole running the last four laps, San Mateo Jaysee established a new national record in the medley relay.

The time was 10m. 22.4s., as against the old national meet mark of 10m. 33.1s. hung up just a year ago by the same institution. Cole holds the national jaysee record in the mile so San Mateo's victory was not unexpected. Pasadena was second tonight and Otto Anderson's team also broke the national mark.

The record-breaking started in the afternoon when Mack Robinson shattered one meet mark himself and helped smash another. First he leaped 24ft. 6½in. during the broad jump trials. This broke the old meet standard in the jaysee division which was set at 24ft. ¾in. last year by Parker of Sacramento.

SPRINT MARK

Later in the afternoon Robinson anchored the Pasadena Jaysee half-mile relay squad and the four Crown City sprinters

flashed over the distance in 1m. 27.2s. The old mark of 1m. 27.8s. was made by Compton in 1934.

Bill Wohle of Sacramento Jaysee bettered the national jaysee record in the shot put, shoving the ball 49ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. He already has a mark of better than 50ft. pending acceptance. Slinger Dunn made the old meet record of 48ft. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. in 1932.

Bakersfield made it three straight winning years in the high school division, capturing the championship with 29 $\frac{1}{2}$ points to 28 for Fresno.
