

Trojans Set Relay Mark

**Miller, Jensen,
Roulac, Zamperini Nab
Medley Baton Event**

FRESNO, May 14. (Exclusive) Shattering the west coast relays record for the medley distance, four fleet runners from the University of Southern California opened the twelfth annual track and field carnival with a smashing victory before 12,000 fans tonight.

Erwin Miller, Ned Jensen, Phil Roulac and Louis Zamperini shared equally in the mark-wrecking achievement which was turned in 10m. 7.5s. As against the old record of 10m. 10s. set two years ago by Stanford. Everybody anticipated that Zamperini would have to start the final mile well behind California's baton carrier, but Louie's teammates completely upset the dope by giving him a substantial lead which he increased materially.

Miller ran his 440 in 47.9s., beating Watts, of California by a yard. Jensen was eight yards in front of Maclise of the Bears after his half-mile excursion. Roulac, running 1320 yards, astonished everybody by beating Mehlert of Berkeley by 25 yards and sending Zamperini away so far ahead that there never was any question as to the outcome. Louie was more than 100 yards in front of Sadaj at the finish and was clocked in 4m. 12.3s for his mile. The Trojans were disappointed they didn't break the approved world's record of 10m. 4s.

Clyde Jeffrey captured the junior college 100 in the smashing time of 9.6s. This equaled the national Jaysee mark and also the west coast relays record. Jeffrey's Riverside teammate, Bryant Allen, was a close second, followed by Price of Compton and Horrell of Pasadena.

TALLEY IN 9.38.

Immediately following this they staged the open in 100, and after six false starts the race was won by Adrian Talley of S.C. A shade more than a yard behind was Arnold Nutting of the Bears. Talley's time was 9.5s., and tied the west coast relays record. Tommy Nelson beat George Anderson out for third place.

Jack Robinson, Pasadena Junior College broad jumper, established a new relays record this

afternoon. Robinson leaped 24 feet 9 7/8 inches to break the old mark set last year by his brother, Mark, of 24 feet 6 3/4 inches.

HURDLERS SPILL

Tough luck hit Lloyd Olson, Trojan hurdler, and Bill Hawkins of Stanford in the first qualifying heat of the 120 yard-high hurdles. Going over the eighth flight Hawkins hit a hurdle which fell in front of Olson. Both men stumbled and fell. At the time of the accident they were battling for first place.

Riverside Junior College dominated the Jaycee sprint parade in the qualifying heats. Clyde Jeffries and Bryant Allen each won their heats in 9.7s. Barney Willis, former Trojan freshman and now a member of the Sacramento J.C. team won the third heat in 10.2s.

Adrian Talley, Troy's star sprinter, coasted to victory in the first heat of the open 100 yard dash. Anderson, of California and Carter, of Whittier tied for third in this race, which was won in 9.8s. In the second heat Nelson, of Fresno was first in 9.8s, followed by Nutting, California, and Berkeley, U.C.L.A.

Jim Humphreys of Troy was an easy winner in the second high hurdle heat which he ran in 14.9s. McBain, of U.C.L.A. qualified for the finals by grabbing a fourth in this heat.

Riverside Junior College's four-man relay team of Jeffery, Allen, Bess, and Culpepper tied the national junior college 880 record of 1:26.6s. in the second qualifying heat.

Gun 'Jump' Enlivens Colorado Track Win

DENVER, May 14.—(P)—Clyde Crosby's 96 second 100 yard dash victory and a dispute over whether the Colorado flier "jumped the gun" enlivened Colorado's triumph over Denver in a Big Seven dual track meet in fine weather today. The score was 95 1/2 to 47 1/2.
