

# West Coast Crown Won by Trojans

FRESNO, May 17.—Harold Davis ran the 100 in 9.4s. and the 220 in 20.2s.

Bob Peoples threw the javelin farther than any native American in history, a distance of 234ft. 3½in.

Those, without any flurry of adjectives, were the standout features of another great Fresno Relays tonight before 14,000 fans.

## TAKE A BOW, DEAN

They completely overshadowed another Southern California Trojan victory in this meet, making it 10 times in the 15 years of the carnival that Coach Dean Cromwell's teams have finished on top here. In fact, so smoothly did the Trojans pick off firsts in relay after relay, in one individual event after another, that it was difficult to realize there was really a team title at stake.

The Trojans piled up 80½ points to 53½ for California, 27 for Stanford, 12 for U.C.L.A., 10 for Fresno, 6 for Drake, 4 for San Diego, 2 for Santa Barbara and 1 for St. Mary's.

Davis, whirlwind flyer from Salinas Jaycee, cannot get official recognition for his two great sprint races tonight, a breeze which was said to be 9 m.p.h. driving him along in both instances.

## MARK EQUALED

On his first appearance tonight Davis skimmed along in time which equaled the world's 100 record, outdistancing his rivals by five yards to take the Junior College finals. Earlier he let Dick Browning of Visalia nip him in a 13.5s. heat when the three starters had only to jog home in order to qualify.

Later tonight Davis ran the fastest 220 in history, his 20.2 effort in exhibition feature shading Jesse Owens universal mark by a tenth of a second. The wind, however, again prevented any record claim. Only one other starter faced the starter's gun, Harold Sinclair of the Bruins finishing 10 yards back.

## BREAKS MARK

Peoples' prodigious throw in the javelin bettered his own American "Native Citizen" mark set when he was a sophomore three years ago, that record having been 234ft. 1¾in. He had another toss tonight of around 232ft.; and Marvin Biles of California was over the 227-ft. mark himself.

Davis' 100 victory made the college century seem tame as Cliff Bourland won with his usual powerful rush. Off to a faster start than usual, the Trojan had a clean cut margin of a yard over Hal Sinclair of the Bruins, with another S.C. runner, Dean Rickman, barely nipping Jim

Jurkovich, of California, for third.

Bourland's time was 9:58, .38 faster than he's done before, indicating something of the helping wind and the natural speed of the yellow clay track.

Carl Merritt chalked up the next Trojan first with a shot-gun victory at 510, 11in., another of his amazingly consistent efforts.

## TROY MEDLEY VICTOR

Southern California opened the evening program with its expected triumph in the medley relay, Upton, Smith, Malone and Weed keeping in front of the opposition all the way. The time was comparatively slow, 10m, 20.4s. In the third leg of the journey Shirley Summers

of California made up all but about three yards on Malone in the 1220 distance.

However, Weed pulled far ahead of Loren McIntyre and Bobby Madrid, California and Fresno, respectively, to come in with nearly a 100-yard victory. McIntyre can-sprinting Madrid to take second spot.

## BEARS BESS MARK

California's attempt at the world's four-man, two-mile relay record failed by just less than three seconds, but the Bear runners were virtually alone all the way and were forced to pace themselves.

The quartet of Johnny Reese, Grover Klemmer, Dick Peter and Clarence Barnes finished in 7m, 28.7s, contrasted to the world's mark of 7m, 35.8s. Klemmer, who is a competitive runner without a great judge of pace, appeared to be running below his top speed.

Drake's highly regarded team had to finish fast to edge out Stanford for the second spot, nearly 100 yards behind the Bears. The time was, however, a meet record.

Southern California took both sprint relays with Bourland anchoring each team. Rickman, Johnson, Kerns and Bourland handled the four-man quarter, the two finishers making victory emphatic in 41.2s.

## CALIFORNIA SECOND

In the four-man 800, the time was 1m, 26.4s; Mason and Crank starting off and Kerns and Bourland finishing. California picked up second-place points in the shorter event, while Stanford took second in the 800.

Southern California's parade of firsts continued in the high hurdles even without the aid of John Browner, out with a muscle injury. Art Kacowicz romped home in 14.4s, with Howard Thomas of Fresno taking second when Troy's Don Hommel hit a hurdle, wrecking his chances.

## WILSON WINS

Johnny Wilson added another S.C. first in the high jump but did only 6ft, 2 1/2in.

However, the Bears balanced these with firsts by Barney Wolf in the discus at 156ft, 2 3/4in. and by Guilan Smith in the college division pole vault where he made 14ft, 6 1/2in. Bill Schaefer of Troy went out at that mark after clearing six inches lower. Earle Meadows and Cornelius Warnerdam continued vaulting beyond that height, but their points were not counted.
