

# Trojans in Uphill Fight to Snag Fresno Relays

FRESNO, May 18.—Although challenged bitterly all the way by the San Francisco Olympic Club, U.C.L.A., San Jose and the L.A.A.C., Coach Dean Cromwell's S.C. Trojans pulled their 15th

West Coast Relays title out of the bag here tonight with a total of 38 1/2 points.

The Winged O, scoring heavily in the field events and distance relays, wound up second with 37 1/2. The Bruins were a surprise third at 31 while the Spartans tied the Mercury squad for fourth at 25 apiece.

## Trojans Given Scare

After apparently sewing up the meet by placing second to U.C.L.A. in the mile relay as the Olympic Club was going scoreless, the Trojans were given a scare when Irving Moore of the Olympic Club hoisted himself over the pole vault bar at 14ft. for a first and teammate Gwynn Smith cleared 13ft. 6in. to deadlock with S.C.'s high-powered pair of Tex Winter and Bob Hart.

But the point flurry left them a half-point shy.

Coach Harry Campbell's Los Angeles City College squad annexed the junior college division title with 50 1/5 points, with Modesto the runner-up with 33 1/5, and Santa Monica third at 28.

Bakersfield scored 15 1/2 markers to cop the high school crown while Sacramento placed second with 12 1/2.

## Sink, Patton Out

The Trojans took a terrific jolt before the evening's festivities started when it was announced that both Mel Patton and Roland Sink, who had been ailing since the California meet last week with sore muscles, were definitely out of the meet. Patton was to have anchored the 440 and 880 teams, while Sink had been scheduled to wind up the distance medley and run a lap on the four-man two mile.

In addition, Al Lawrence, co-favorite with Dixon in the high sticks, was not allowed to run because he didn't appear for the prelims in the afternoon.

With John Fulton and Mushy Girard running fine 1320 and mile laps, the Olympic Club won the first open division relay of the night by 12 yards over Stanford in 10p. 30s.

Don Smalley of San Jose annexed the 100 with a foot victory over Terry Haws of California, while Bob Heck of Alameda N.A.S. was clocked in the same time in nabbing the servicemen's century.

Although they didn't have it out in the high sticks, Lawrence and Dixon hooked up in a stirring finish of the 880-yard baton chase. San Jose's Billy Rhyne started the final furlong with a yard lead with Lawrence sec-

ond and Dixon three yards behind.

Both went by the Spartan flash in the last 20 strides with the Trojan flyer breasting the tape with a yard to spare. The time was 1m. 29s.

Fulton and Girard teamed up again to net the Olympic Club a 20-yard triumph in the two-mile relay while San Jose upset the Trojans in the 440 event at 42.1s.

Actually the most significant marks were recorded in the individual events. Willie Steele of San Diego State broad jumped 25ft. 5/8in.; Craig Dixon established a new U.C.L.A. record in scoring a five-yard triumph in the high hurdles at 14.4s.; Wilbur Thompson of S.C. put the shot 53ft. 2in.; Bobby Peoples, representing the L.A.A.C., hurled the javelin 205ft. 11in., and San Jose's Bob Likens was second at 201ft.; three athletes exceeded 150ft. in the discus with Pete Zagar of the Olympic Club first with 152ft. 10in.

Los Angeles won the distance medley, two-mile and mile relays for the bulk of their points while Nick Giovinnazzo contributed a blue ribbon in the broad jump.
