

Five Yankee Conference records were shattered, and another was tied yesterday afternoon on sunny Centennial Field as the Rhode Island Rams copped their seventh straight Conference title.

The Rhodies picked up a total of 66 1-2 points during the course of the afternoon, while New Hampshire was second with 35 1-2. Maine's 21 markers guaranteed a third place finish.

The host UVM aggregation ended up fourth with 14 1-2 digits, just 1-2 point in front of the fifth place University of Massachusetts thinclads.

Bringing up the rear was Connecticut with 12 1-2 points. Vermont, was the only squad that didn't boast a first place winner.

The closest Archie Post's thinclads came to a first place was when Dan Manson finished just a shade behind Bob Sands of Rhode Island in the 100-yard dash. Sands tied the Yankee Conference record for this event with a brilliant time of 9.9.

Later, Manson again came up with a second place, this time in the 220-yard dash.

Ron Doornbosch posted thirds in both the hammer throw and the discus. Bobby Lovejoy came up with a surprise second in the high jump, and Guy of Vermont was fourth in the same event.

Don Grady's third place showing in the mile run was the only other bright spot of the afternoon for the UVM following.

Rhode Island's Joe Pizzo pulled a "Bob Mathias" by breaking two Conference records in one afternoon.

The husky Pizzo threw the javelin for 179' 8", which was good enough to break the old mark of 177' 10", set in 1948 by Styrna of N. H. His second

history-maker came when Pizzo went the 440 in a nifty 49.4.

The University of Massachusetts' Jim Hoss established a new 880 with a sizzling 1:57.0 pace, and Jim Parker of N. H., did the 120 yard high hurdles in 14.9 for another new mark.

Don Grady of UVM seemed to be moving fairly well in the mile, and was about to overtake winner Bill McQuattie of Rhode Island, but the blond Catamount broke his stride and lost his sense of balance, just long enough to end up third.
